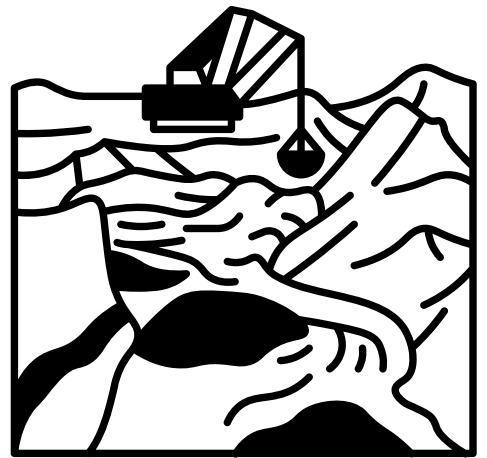

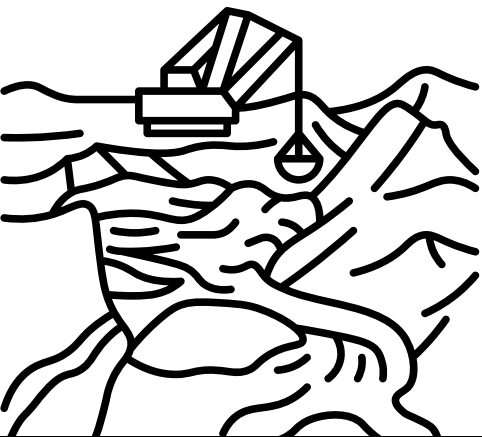
District Mineral Foundation

In India, the Mining industry is regulated under the Mines and Minerals Development and Regulation (MMDR) Act, 1957. Further in the year 2015 MMDR Act was amended, bringing into effect the changes in the regulations governing the mining area. The Amended Act introduced Section 9B which mandates the State Government for setting up of District Mineral Foundation (DMF) in every district affected by the mining related operations for the benefit of communities affected by such operations.

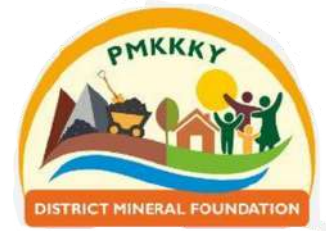
Mining-affected communities have faced various issues related to livelihood, socio-economic, health, drinking water etc. Realization of the same led to the creation of DMF as part of benefit sharing and inclusive growth. DMF works in the interest and benefits of the persons and areas affected by mining-related activities. As per the Act, mining companies have been notified to deposit payments to DMFs as per notification by the center. The rules for functions, accountability, transparency etc. of DMFs are within the purview of state governments as per the guidelines of PMKKKY.

Accordingly, the state of Goa has notified Goa DMF (Trust) Rules 2018, vide notification no. DMG/MMDR/DMF/01/2015/7633-Dated 08 January 2019. As per the rules, DMFs are to work for the socio-economic development of areas and communities affected by mining operations by carrying out various projects to address issues related to Education, Healthcare, livelihood, skill development etc.

Introduction to District Mineral Foundation (DMF) and PMKKKY

The Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957, was amended in 2015 to introduce a new section, 9B, which mandated the establishment of District Mineral Foundations (DMFs) in districts affected by mining operations. The primary objective of DMFs is to work for the welfare and development of people and areas impacted by mining activities, as prescribed by the respective State Governments. Funded by statutory contributions from mining lease holders, DMFs play a crucial role in ensuring that the benefits of mining extend to those directly and indirectly affected by these operations. In September 2015, the Central Government introduced the Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojana (PMKKKY), a scheme to be implemented by DMFs. The PMKKKY aims to mitigate the adverse impacts of mining and ensure long-term sustainable livelihoods for affected communities.

Objectives and Guidelines of PMKKKY

The PMKKKY is implemented by DMFs using funds generated from mining activities, with three main objectives. Firstly, it aims to implement various developmental and welfare projects in mining-affected areas, complementing existing State and Central Government schemes. Secondly, it seeks to minimize the negative impacts of mining on the environment, health, and socio-economic conditions of the people in these areas. Lastly, the scheme ensures sustainable livelihoods for those affected by mining. The MMDR Amendment Act, 2021, empowered the Central Government to issue directions regarding the composition and utilization of DMF funds. These include orders to include MPs, MLAs, and MLCs in the DMF Governing Council, prohibit the transfer of DMF funds to state-level funds or other non-DMF schemes, and mandate the preparation of a five-year Perspective Plan for the systematic development of mining-affected areas.



Identification of Affected Areas and People

Identifying affected areas and people under the PMKKKY is a critical aspect of its implementation. Affected areas are classified as directly or indirectly affected. Directly affected areas include villages or urban localities where mining operations are active and where communities depend on these areas for their livelihoods. Indirectly affected areas are those where local populations suffer from the economic, social, and environmental consequences of mining activities, even if they are not in close proximity to the mining sites. The DMF is responsible for maintaining an updated list of these areas. Similarly, affected people include those who have legal or occupational rights over mined land, those with traditional usufruct rights, and individuals whose livelihoods have been disrupted by mining. The identification process involves consultation with local elected representatives to ensure accuracy and inclusivity.

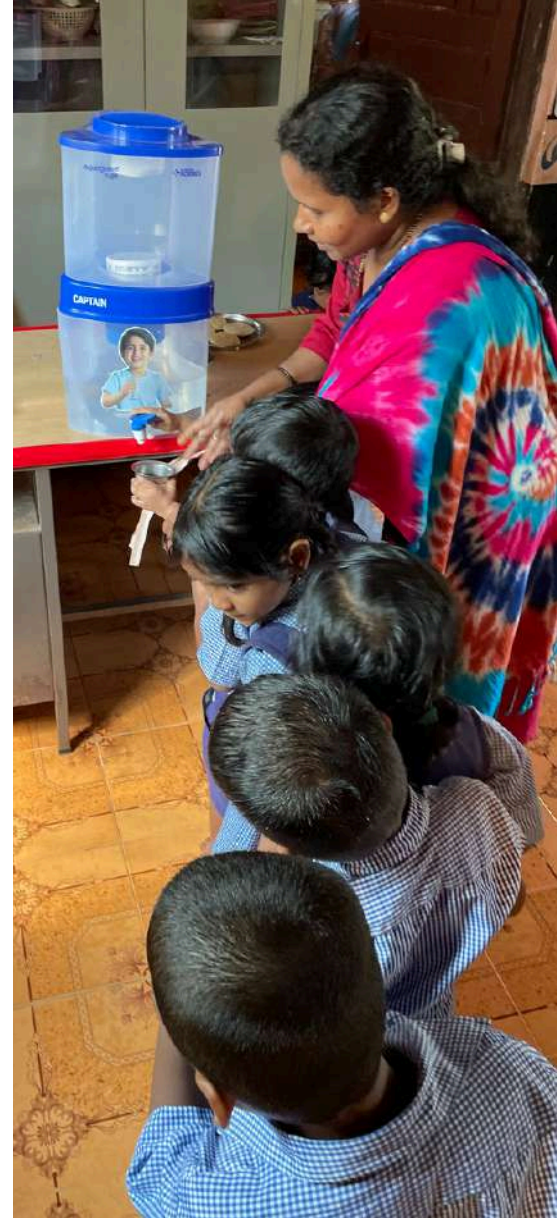


General Guidelines for Effective Implementation

The implementation of PMKKKY is guided by several key principles to maximize its effectiveness. The scheme encourages convergence with existing State and Central Government programs to avoid duplication and ensure that DMF funds complement ongoing development efforts. Administrative and supervisory costs are capped at 5% of the annual DMF receipts, with the establishment of a Project Management Unit (PMU) recommended for districts with annual collections exceeding ₹50 crores. This PMU is essential for planning, technical, accounting, and monitoring support. Additionally, DMFs are advised to maintain an endowment fund, not exceeding 10% of annual receipts, to support sustainable livelihoods in areas where mining activities have ceased. For mines that impact areas across multiple districts, the DMF must allocate funds proportionately to ensure that all affected regions benefit from the scheme. Overall, these guidelines aim to ensure the DMF funds are utilized efficiently and effectively to achieve the long-term goals of sustainable development and community welfare in mining-affected regions.

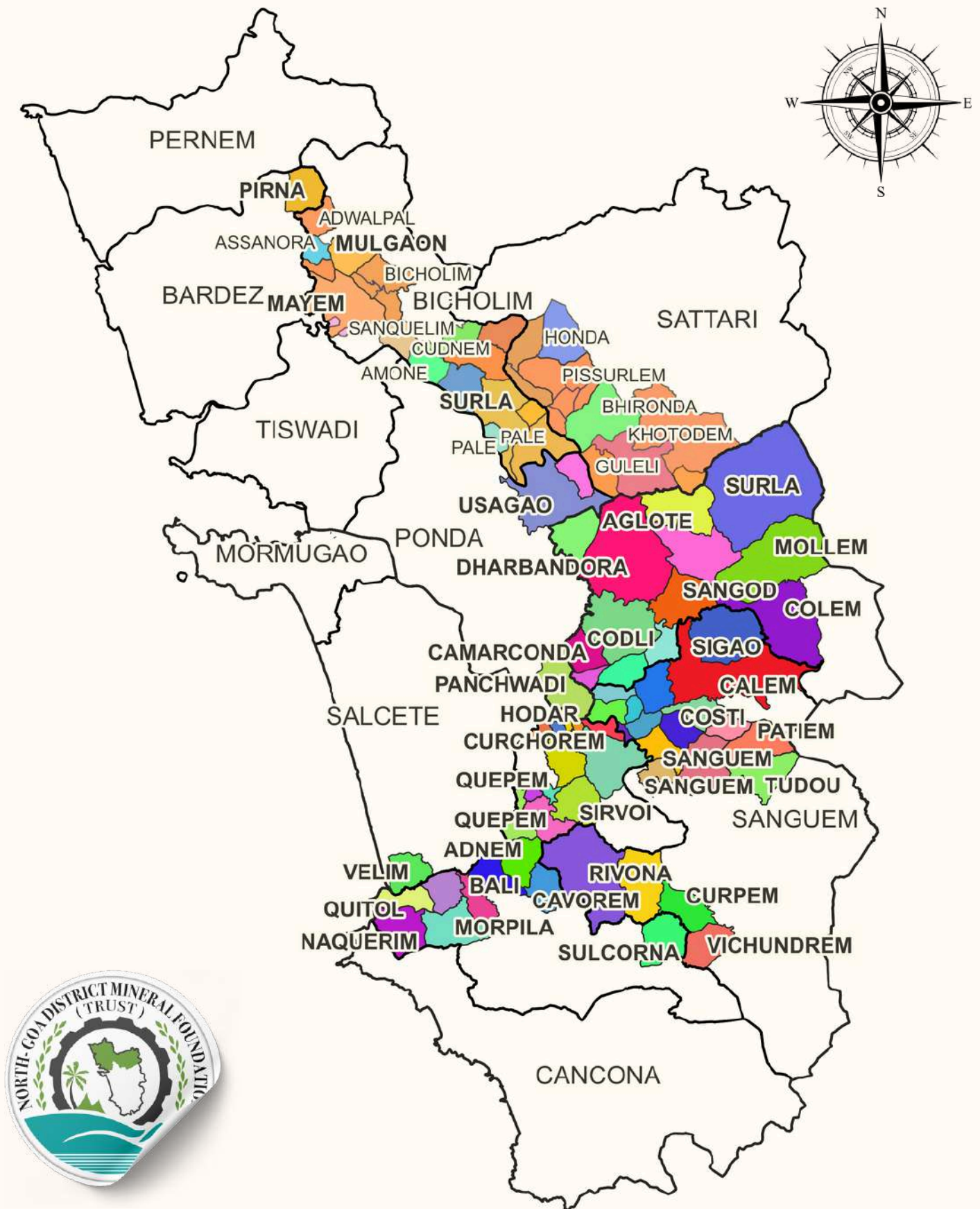

Formation of the District Mineral Foundation



District Mineral Foundation (DMF) was established in the State for both the Districts, North Goa and South Goa by Government of Goa through notification no.

DMG/MMDR/DMF/OI/2015/

under the 'MMDR' Amendment Act, 2015, on 30th April 2015 by the Directorate of Mines and Geology Department. Also, the Directorate of Mines and Geology through its notification no.

DMG/MMDR/DMF/OI/2015/7633,- (Dated: 08 January 2019), framed the rules for regulating the manner of working and functioning of the DMFs in Goa with the help of the PMKKKY Scheme launched in 2015. The District Mineral Foundations was setup with objective of working for the benefit and interest of the persons and areas affected by the mining related operations.



Project Management Unit

Formation and Role of Project Management Unit (PMU)



To enhance the capacity of DMFs and ensure the effective utilization of DMF funds, the formation of a Project Management Unit (PMU) is strongly recommended. The PMU serves as a dedicated body that provides planning, technical, accounting, and monitoring support to the DMF, ensuring that projects are executed efficiently and transparently. The PMU may engage qualified personnel on a contractual basis, focusing on specific project needs under the PMKKKY. The establishment of a PMU is intended to streamline the implementation of development projects, allowing for better coordination and oversight. It also helps in aligning the DMF's initiatives with broader state and Sustainable development goals.

In May 2021, Mineral Foundation of Goa was appointed as the Project Management Unit for the District Mineral Foundation (Trust), North Goa/South Goa.

The Project Management Unit was appointed to work closely with the DMF, line departments and stakeholders; to identify projects benefiting the local communities, scrutinize proposals for their benefit and sustainability, inter-departmental working and communication, monitoring of execution, data handling and report preparation.

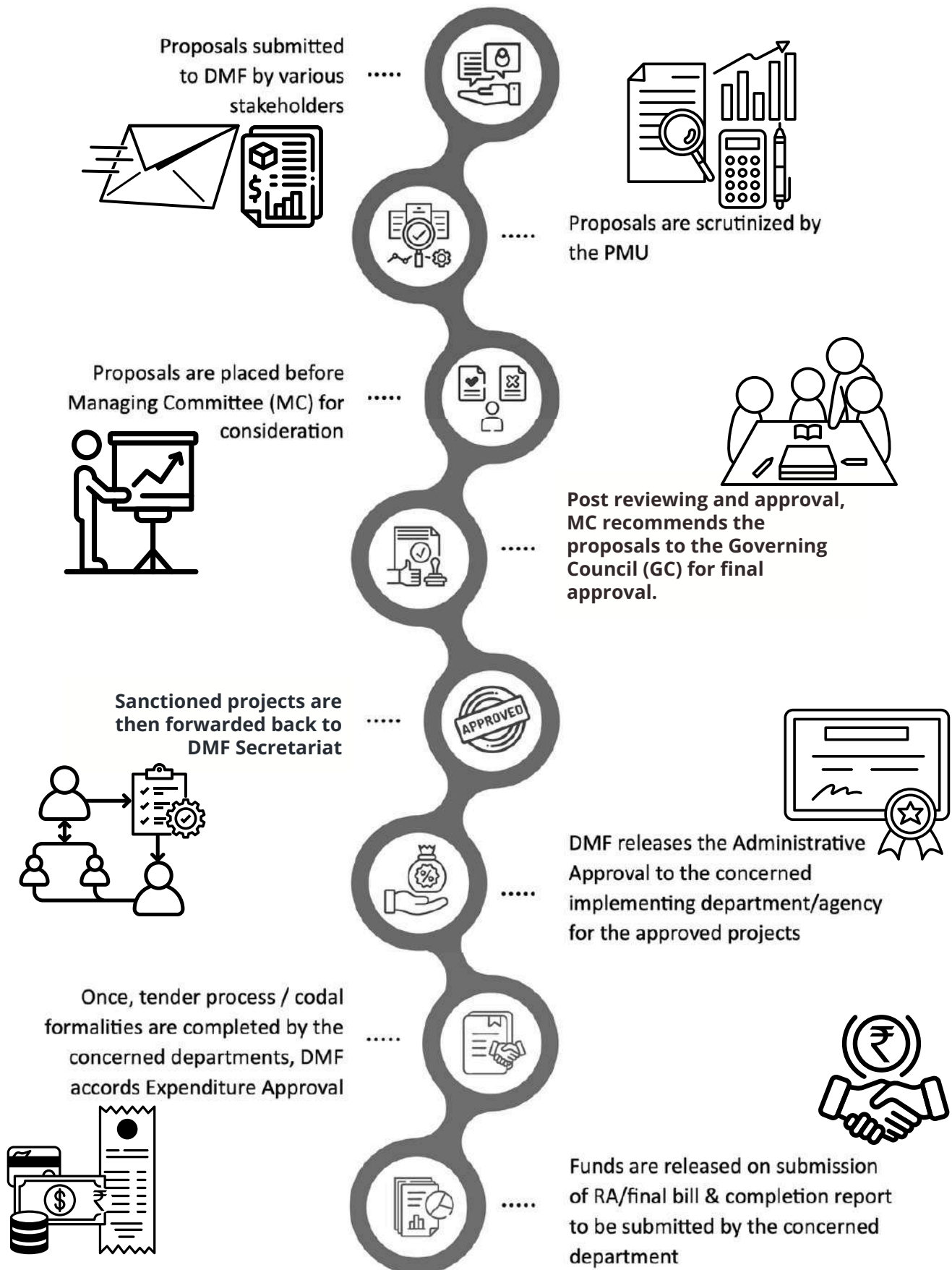

Augmentation of water supply to Velguem, Surla and Pale

Pontoon for Water Pumping and Filtration tanks

This project setup of augmentation of drinking water supply was inaugurated on 16 July 2023. This installation of a floating pontoon and a **422 HP** water pump on the Ganjem River, New Mhadei Dam has significantly improved access to clean and safe drinking water for **1,965 households**, benefiting approximately **9,800 villagers**. Equipped with submersible pumps, the system ensures a continuous and efficient water supply, addressing previous issues of water shortages and contamination.

Filtration Tanks



Before this initiative, villagers had to rely on unfiltered water sources, leading to health risks and waterborne diseases. However, with the purification units now operating at full capacity, households receive safe, potable water, reducing health hazards and improving overall hygiene and well-being.

This initiative has been a lifeline for the community, ensuring that families no longer struggle for basic water access. The improved supply has also supported local agriculture, sanitation, and daily household needs, enhancing the quality of life for thousands of residents.

Improvement of Water Supply System in Mayem Constituency

The water supply system in Kelbaiwada, Gaonkarwada, Chimulwada, and Poirā has been significantly upgraded, benefiting over 2,000 residents. The previous concrete pipelines were old, frequently damaged, and prone to leakage and breakages, leading to inconsistent water supply.

To address these challenges, the existing infrastructure was replaced with durable and modern pipelines, ensuring a reliable and uninterrupted water supply. This upgrade has greatly improved the quality of life for residents by reducing water wastage and enhancing overall accessibility to clean water.

This initiative highlights the commitment to sustainable water management and infrastructure development in mining-affected areas, ensuring a better quality of life for the community.

Smart Boards for 36 high Schools in North Goa

Two years ago, the North Goa District Mineral Foundation (NGDMF) took a significant step in advancing digital inputs in education by funding the installation of Smart Boards in 36 schools. Since then, these interactive digital boards have transformed traditional classrooms into dynamic learning spaces, benefiting **more than 2500 students**. The teachers have embraced this technology using multimedia content, animations and real-time explanations to simplify complex concepts, making learning more engaging and effective.

Sector - Education

The North Goa District Mineral Foundation (DMF) funded the renovation of two Government Primary Schools and one Government High School in the mining-affected areas of North Goa, significantly improving the learning environment for students. The schools underwent infrastructure upgrades, including better classrooms, improved sanitation, and enhanced drinking water facilities. These renovations provided students with a safer, more comfortable, and conducive atmosphere for education. The initiative also benefited teachers by offering well-equipped classrooms, making the teaching process more effective. By addressing critical infrastructure gaps, the DMF's support has helped uplift the quality of education in these rural schools, fostering better academic performance and overall development.

Educational Transportation in Mining affected Areas



The Governing Council in order to streamline transportation of school students in under serviced areas of mining belt, thought of providing 5 school buses. Thus, specific routes were carefully selected in consultation with the Education Department & Elected representative to cater to the needs of students residing in these areas. This dedicated school bus service will significantly benefit students, especially those travelling long distances, by ensuring a safe, comfortable, and punctual commute. The NGDMF sanctioned the purchase of 5 school buses for the use of the Education Department. The buses will be operated and maintained by the Education Department either on their own or through KTCL and will benefit students from these areas irrespective of the schools where they study. This project was sanctioned in the Governing Council meeting held on 24 January 2024 for 1.75 Cr, and the buses are expected to be on road by the end of the academic year 2024-2025

Transportation through KTCL for Sonshi & Honda

► The State Level Monitoring Committee had recommended facilitation of school student transport on two routes namely, Soliem- Sonshi route and Honda- Sakhli route. Subsequently the NGDMF tied up with Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited (KTCL) to provide transportation facilities for the schools students on these routes. The facility is presently availed by the students of the Government High School, Honda and Progress High School, Sankhlim, and Govt Higher Secondary School, Sakhlim. This initiative aimed to ensure the safe and timely arrival of nearly **90 plus students** to their respective schools, in these mining-affected areas. The facility was commenced since 2018, So far the NGDMF has paid ₹23,41,280 till March 2024. This facility is expected to continue till a permanent solution is designed to address this situation which hopefully will be done by the financial year 2024-2025.

The North Goa District Mineral Foundation (DMF) financed the purchase of utensils and water purifiers for 97 Anganwadis across North Goa to improve hygiene and nutrition standards for young children. The procurement was done by the Directorate of Women & Child through Goa State Co-operative Marketing and Supply Federation Ltd. The distribution ceremony for Bicholim was done at the hands of Dr Chandrakant Shetye, Hon'ble MLA of Bicholim, and also the members of the Governing Council NGDMF. This initiative ensures access to clean drinking water and better meal preparation facilities, directly benefiting the health and well-being of more than 500 kids in 97 Anganwadi centres. The DMF's support reinforces its commitment to improving community welfare in mining-affected areas.

Sector - Any Other measures for Enhancing Environmental Quality

Quick Response vehicle & Equipment



Budget ₹1,72,31,259/-

The Fire and Emergency Department, with support from the North Goa District Mineral Foundation (Trust), received two quick response vehicles along with essentials. Since their deployment at the fire stations viz, Bicholim, Mapusa and Valpoi. these vehicles have significantly improved response time to emergencies. Over the years, they have been used in **more than 300 emergency calls**, assisting in fire incidents, roadblocks caused by fallen trees, and flood rescue operations in mining-affected areas. Additionally, the vehicles were also kept on standby to support emergency response services during the National Games, further ensuring public safety. Their presence continues to provide timely assistance and relief to affected communities, making disaster management efforts more efficient and impactful.

Sector - Health Care

North Goa District Mineral Foundation Procured Ambulance for Community Health Centre in North Goa



The fully equipped ambulance procured by the North Goa District Mineral Foundation (NGDMF) for the Community Health Centre (CHC) in Bicholim has proven to be a vital asset in providing emergency medical services to the mining-affected region. Since its integration into the healthcare system, the ambulance attends over **30 emergency calls per month**, ensuring timely medical intervention for critical cases, including accidents, medical emergencies, snake bites and maternal care.

This initiative has significantly reduced response time, allowing patients to receive urgent medical attention and improving survival rates in severe cases. The presence of this dedicated emergency vehicle has strengthened the overall healthcare infrastructure, providing reliable and accessible medical transport for the local community. 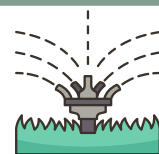
